

PeK Automotive, a producer of autonomous electrical vehicles for agriculture, has inaugurated new production premises and offices in Logatec, some 30 km southwest of Ljubljana. The company will manufacture its vehicles entirely in Slovenia.



It develops products for civil protection and the army, as well as tailored solutions, according to PeK Automotive executive director Ajda Cuderman.

The company, which has been operating under the Turkish Peker Holding since 2019, has invested around €20 million.



It currently employs 96 people.

And increase the number to 140 once production is fully operational. It expects added value per employee to reach between €120,000 and €140,000.
